New and Improved Hair Transplant Techniques

Today's hair transplants are much more natural-looking and safer than older methods.

Common Modern Techniques

• **FUE (Follicular Unit Extraction):** Individual hair roots are taken one by one.

• **Strip Method:** A thin strip of skin with hair is removed and divided into small grafts.

• **FUHT (Follicular Unit Hair Transplantation):** Considered the best method because it keeps hair in natural groupings, giving the most natural results.

Many clinics now do large sessions (2000+ grafts) in one

sitting. This saves donor hair and reduces the number of surgeries a person needs.

New Technology: Robots & Image-Guided Systems

Modern technology aims to make the procedure:

- Faster
- More accurate
- Less tiring for the surgeon

New machines can use cameras and computer guidance to both remove and implant hair using the same device. One new system shows 89% accuracy in finding hair follicles—very high compared to older tools.

Before the Procedure: Important Preparation

Good preparation helps ensure a successful transplant.

Patients must:

- Understand that full results appear only after 9–10 months
- Know that hair loss can continue, so ongoing medicines are often needed

Before surgery:

- Stop minoxidil two weeks before
- Avoid alcohol and NSAIDs (like ibuprofen) for at least one week because they increase bleeding
- Do routine blood tests such as blood count and clotting time

After the Procedure: What to Expect

Patients are usually given antibiotics and painkillers.

Common temporary side effects:

- Swelling on the forehead around day 3–5 (goes away with ice packs)
 - Temporary hair shedding before new hair starts to grow
 - Small pimples around month 2–3 as new hair comes through—this is normal
- These issues are usually mild and go away on their own.

Long-Term Outlook

Modern hair transplantation is a scientific, highly refined medical procedure, not just a cosmetic treatment. Success rates today are above 90%, thanks to better tools and better care. While some transplanted hair may thin slightly over 3–5 years, combining surgery with proper medications gives the most natural and long-lasting results.
